Participation in NIRF-2022 and Gauhati University placed in the 88 rank in Overall category.

Environmental/Green and Energy Audit for Gauhati University was conducted for the year 2022-23 and a follow-up of the Action Taken was done based on the previous year's Environmental and Energy Audit. An External Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) was conducted with Peer Teams for the academic year 2022-23 and follow-up of the Action Taken was done based on the previous year's internal AAA. Moreover, Library Audit was conducted for the year 2021-22 and 2022-23.

IQAC, Gauhati University played a proactive role for implementation of Four Year Undergraduate Programme ((FYUP) in the light of NEP 2020 from the academic year 2023-24 for about 300+ affiliated colleges and institutions under Gauhati University. The FYUGP has been declared for the state of Assam by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Assam from Gauhati University on 3rd June 2023. Gauhati

University also started Integrated Masters Programme (4+1) in its campus for 2023-24. Moreover, the Gauhati University has conducted a series of interactive and awareness programme for implementation of FYUP for its own faculties, faculties from affiliated colleges and Principals of the colleges at various level. A Vice Chancellor's (Assam) meet also has been organized at Gauhati University to fix the minimum common academic calendar, examination systems, credit and grading pattern etc. NEP 2020 to prepare the roadmap for implementation of FYUGP for its own campus as well as for more than 350 Gauhati University affiliated colleges.

In-house Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP modules) as a part of E-governance initiative for integrated admission, examination and other activities (onlinegu.com) has been strengthened. All the committees like Institutional Biosafety Committee, Institutional Ethics Committee, Animal Ethics Committee, IIPC, Consultancy Policy, Research and Development Policy, Policy for person with Disability etc. were revised. Renewal of the contract with 'FRESH AIR' has been done for the collection and maintenances of biomedical and laboratory wastes.

The AQAR for the academic year 2021-22 has been successfully submitted. Moreover, for the AQAR of 2022-23, data collection, feedback analysis, and compilation were completed and submission will be done very soon.

16.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Keeping in view the multidisciplinary nature of the prospects and problems of the development systems, Gauhati University has systematically adopted/ promoted an interdisciplinary spirit and approach in designing and implementing the courses, especially for capacity building on the part of the students. The University has now emerged as a leading institution of higher education in the Northeastern region of India in order to provide thoughtful, comprehensive, and realistic kind of multidisciplinary education to overcome the constraints of traditional disciplinary boundaries and limitations.

Noteworthy that, the multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary education systems of Gauhati University have already been reflected in some already established academic departments and research/ study centers, such as Environmental Science, North East Studies, Foreign Language Studies, Sociology, Mass communication, Library and Information Science, Women's studies, Folklore Research, etc where students from different academic backgrounds can opt their degrees and diplomas from these departments and study/research centers.

Importantly, under the NEP 2020 that was launched by Gauhati University in 2023, there have been made flexible/multidisciplinary degree options to provide students a great opportunity to pursue two or more disciplines that may better suit their educational and career goals.

17. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Gauhati University registered in National Data Depository on 16-04-2019 and at present 20,190 students have registered in the account. As part of the NEP 2020 initiative Gauhati University initiated the process of Academic Bank of Credit and at present 19,782 students have been using the service till now (Souce: Academic Bank of Credit, Ministry of Education, Govt. of Education)

18.Skill development:

Gauhati University has come forward as a pioneering university in Northeast India in promoting many skill development courses in almost all academic disciplines. Gauhati University, in collaboration with industries and Government agencies, has rightly identified various important skills that have high demand in the industrial and other socio-economic sectors, and as such introduced many skill development courses in the curriculum to draw attention from the potential employers towards the students and researchers.

The University has been conducting some integrated skill-based courses and training workshops covering a wide range of skills, such as surveying and mapping, geoinformatics skills, UAV training, soft skill development, public speaking, graphic designing, digital literacy and technical abilities, academic writing, programming, communication, various software applications, problem-solving, entrepreneurship development, vocational training, and language proficiency, etc for empowering its students and faculty members with a diverse range of skills.

Besides, many departments of the University encourage students to join in internship and experiential learning opportunities in certain geographical areas, industries, and other academic and research institutions in order to enable students enabled towards apply their skills in real-world situations and to achieve field-based work experience, confidence and employability as well.

19. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Gauhati University has provided students with a balanced and complementary set of knowledge and skills that enables them to grow while being rooted in the Indian knowledge system through some dedicated courses. Courses on yoga, Vedic- Mathematics, value-based education, etc. at Gauhati University focus on key aspects of the Indian knowledge system. Moreover, the university offers courses spanning across various disciplines that infuse a deeper appreciation of traditional values, ethics, and human behavior. Departments like Sanskrit, Assamese, MIL, Comparative Literature, Philosophy, etc. offer courses that encourage students to discuss the works of prominent Indian thinkers like Swami Vivekananda, Rabindranath Tagore, and Mahatma Gandhi and thus build an understanding of the roots of Indian philosophy and wisdom. Through integration of the Indian philosophical teachings and literature, the university strives to nurture students as socially responsible individuals.

Another prominent way in which Gauhati University has integrated the Indian knowledge system is in courses on folklore and performing arts. Integration of Indian art forms like Indian classical music, dance, and painting has enabled students to delve deep into these art forms and appreciate the rich cultural heritage of the country.

20. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Gauhati University has a well-designed outcome-based education system that empower students with knowledge and skills to successfully meet the needs of the dynamic and challenging world. First, through the well-designed outcome-based curricula, Gauhati University has promoted autonomous learning. The University makes the well-defined learning outcomes accessible to the students in order to ensure that students are completely aware of what is expected of them and can put their efforts accordingly. Second, the focus on the outcome-based education has also enabled the university to build an effective assessment and feedback mechanism. The practice of continuous assessment, provision of regular feedback and mentoring practice for understanding student's strength and weaknesses have allowed to adopt timely measures and offer personalized support to facilitate academic

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and personal growth of the students.

Third, the University has made its best efforts to align the course and programme outcomes to the industry demands and societal needs. The University has facilitated, where needed, collaboration with industry experts and their laboratories or institutions to help students get exposure and experience for acquiring advanced and relevant practical knowledge and skills.

21.Distance education/online education:

Gauhati University has achieved notable progress in the field of distance and online education. To begin with, Gauhati University has undertaken quality distance learning initiatives through its Gauhati University Centre for Distance and Online Education (GUCDOE), formerly known as the Institute of Distance and Open Learning (IDOL). This Centre offers an extensive range of courses and academic qualifications that are tailored to the needs of working individuals, residents in remote regions, dropouts of regular education, and those facing challenges to attend regular classes of conventional education. By prioritizing inclusivity, the university has facilitated fulfillment of the educational ambitions of thousands of students which would have been otherwise near impossible for those students.

Moreover, Gauhati University has utilized advanced technologies with the aim to maximize learning opportunities for the students. By utilizing virtual classrooms, multimedia resources, and digital evaluations, the university has offered an interactive environment to distance learners and ensured high-quality education equivalent to that in regular education. Additionally, the university has made an online learning platform available to distance learners to facilitate effortless access to study resources, lectures, and other academic support.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problemsolving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

All the departments adopt some common student-centric methods for enhancing the student's learning experiences. The experiential learning methods include participation in symposia, project work, field visits, educational tours, industrial visits, internship programs, etc. The participative learning techniques include group discussion, hands-on training programs, seminar presentations, debates, quizzes, classroom brainstorming sessions, peer learning, and team teaching. Problem-solving abilities of the students are encouraged through assignments on a regular basis and evaluation of their performance is conducted through periodic internal assessment examinations. Further, they are motivated to participate in scholastic as well as co-scholastic events

organized within the university and beyond. The students are also provided the opportunity to interact with distinguished personalities and alumni from both academic/non-academic backgrounds so as to make them aware of the application/employability aspect of their concerned subjects. To enhance the learning ability of students at an individual level, the assigned mentors pay special attention to their mentees. The students enrolled under the faculty of science gain practical knowledge on the respective subject through laboratory experiments (both dry and wet laboratory), and study of standard/type samples/specimens present in the departmental museum. Teachers make use of ICT tools to capture the attention of students as well as to keep them abreast of the advanced knowledge in the subject.

In order to encourage the use of ICT in the teaching-learning process, the entire university campus is equipped with a Wi-Fi facility. In classroom interaction, teachers use different media such as PowerPoint presentations through LCD monitor and projector, smartboard, Zoom, CISCO Webex, Jiomeet, Skype, MOODLE classroom, Google Meet, etc. The students as well as the teachers gather subject-related information from various electronic resources accessible to them, such as e-Books, e-Notes, Journal Articles, NPTEL, SWAYAM, DELCON consortium, Open source software, Udemy, Coursera, e-PG Pathsala, National Digital Library, Shodhganga, ShodhSindhu, e-PG Pathsala, Youtube videos, online corpus, various websites, GU Subscribed Journals, Bookfi, etc. Regular two-way communication between teachers and students is established effectively through diverse media such as Whatsapp, Google Classroom, e-mail, etc. Some subject-specific resources are also used by the teachers such as online astronomy data of the 2.5 m telescope of Apache Point Observatory, New Mexico through SkyServer Databases, SkyServerWorkbook, and graphing software to visualize concepts discussed in the class (Physics), Cambridge Structural Database (CSD), X-ray database (ICDD PDF4+) (Chemistry) to name a few.

Information technology was included in the management of the Examination System by the Office of the Controller of Examinations. the cumulative grade point, the grade, the percentage, and the mark entry Preparation, analysis, and average (CGPA) are automated. Each semester's mark statement is available

to restricted users, particularly to the Department Heads, to periodically evaluate student performance and mentor them. Challan for the Payment of Examination Fees and Hall Tickets are produced by a computer. The examination fee being paid has been updated to the online version. Students can download their hall tickets by logging onto the Controller of Examinations website. By entering their Roll Number and authenticating it with their Date of Birth, students can log in to the university website and view their total grade for academic performance. The hierarchical structure, working in tandem with the examination committee chaired by the institution's leader, has improved the integrity of examinations and reduced grievance and unfair practices cases. 2.6 - Student Performance and Learning Outcomes

The University has well-defined and explicitly stated learning outcomes/graduate attributes of different programmes which are being offered and they are accessible to the stakeholders via Prospectus and displayed on the university website. There exists a specifically designed framework of curriculum, instructional activities and assessment to promote learning at different levels. Programmes under all faculties have linked the course outcomes to the programme-specific outcomes and programme outcomes, and have measured their attainment through both direct and indirect methods.

The direct mode of evaluation includes formative and summative evaluation with internal and external components. The internal component comprises- periodic and consistent assessment through group discussions, periodic tests, home assignments, classroom interaction, seminar presentations, projects, etc. The external component comprises - end-term assessments through theory and practical examinations, submission of project reports and Dissertations, etc.

Several programmes are evaluated for the attainment of outcomes also through practical components like fieldwork, internship, teaching practicum and/or lab course. Department of Education initiates Experiential Learning through village surveys in neighbourhood areas focusing on real-life issues.

Many departments have measured the attainment levels also by

collecting feedback from the students on the course contents.

The Course Outcomes of the programmes are Specific Measurable Attainable Relevant and Time-bound (SMART) reflected in students' performance in various competitive exams, placement records and progression in higher education at different fields.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The institution has adequate facilities for teaching - learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment, etc.

Gauhati University is wellequipped with teaching-learning facilities like classrooms, computing environments, and laboratories with advanced scientific instruments. The university has as many as 144 well-ventilated classrooms, in46 departmentswhich house 439 faculty members amounting to a faculty-to-student ratio of 1: 10. At present, the University campus security is upgraded with CCTV surveillance system at vital points like entry and exit points and several departments and also the administrative block. The Wi-Fi facility is freely available for the students and general stakeholders of the University at 1Gbps speed. Several departments have their own computer labs; the total number of computers across all departments amounts to 1678. The University also has subscriptions to prominent journals and e-

books which can be directly accessed from all the departments.

Currently, there are 145 laboratories as well as 38. seminar halls across all the departments. The facilities contents like the Brahmaputra Study Centre, GUINEIS.

The University houses a Biodiversity Park, an ST Radar facility, a Botanical garden, An observatory, and a museum in the Department of Folklore Research, Anthropology, and Geography.

Various modern state-of-the-art instruments in the university include equipment like HR400, spectrometer, XRD, XRF, SCXRD, HPCC, powder X-ray analyzer, GC Mass spectrometer, and H-NMR Spectrometer. Further, for instrument-related works, there are different facilities like Analytical Instrument facilities, fabrication labs, glass-blowing shops, welding shops, mechanical workshops, machine workshops, carpenter shops electronic shops, and electronic workshops.

Gauhati University provides an excellent environment for residential and hostel facilities for teachers, officers and students which is being constantly upgraded. All faculties are offered quarter facilities within the campus, and hostel facilities are available for the enrolled students each year(For both boys and girls). There are guest houses for visitors, an indoor sports complex, several outdoor sports facilities, one inhome market complex, 7 well-equipped restaurants, several food courts and canteen, one government post office, two banks, and 4ATMS within the campus. The Gauhati University has a hospital facility, NCC< NSS C ell, A child day care centre, GU Mod3el School, GU Recreation Centre and Radio Luit centre.

GU also has established an Amphitheatre, one large auditorium(BKB Auditorium), 2 seminar halls for regular use(PD seminar hall and AT seminar Hall), an alumni cum Guest house, Brahmaputra Study Centre, one central library(KK Handiqui library), the e-moot court under the department of law, centre for performing arts, GUINEIS, a recording set up at GUINEIS, ICHR (Indian council for Historical Research), NEP building, IGNOU Centre, UGC-HRDC(human resource

development centre) and a GU press.

For sports and outdoor facilities, there are 2 large playgrounds, 22 parks, a public temple, and get-together centre, and several statues of renowned dignitaries, along with a well-built network of concrete roads within the campus.

4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

The process of automation in the KKH Library was initiated with the execution of CDS/ISIS in the year 1995. It was in the year 2001 the Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) SOUL 1.0 of INFLIBNET was installed in the KKHLibrary. In 2009 it was upgraded to SOUL 2.0 and in the year 2022, it was upgraded to SOUL 3.0. The entire library management system is used for acquisition, library cataloging, issue and return of books, library user database, a database of a number of books and journals of the library, searching and browsing using OPAC and Web OPAC.

A major step in the digitization of 1,50,000 manuscripts in the KKH Library has been achieved under the NMM (National Mission for Manuscripts) through IGNCA (Indira Gandhi National Centre for Arts) New Delhi. Ph.D. theses are uploaded in the ShodhGanga repository of INFLIBNET (shodhganga.inflibnet.ac.in) center and presently 6,223 Ph.D. theses have been archived. Initially, this project functioned under the ProQuest (PQDT) archive under which 8,52,524 pages were digitized. Institutional Repository created by KKH Library is another platform where DSpace software is used(http://10.10.114.8:8080/jspui) for digitized documents like MPhil dissertations and another 287 e-resources.

GOVERNANCE, LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT

6.1 - Institutional Vision and Leadership

6.1.1 - The institution has a clearly stated vision and mission which are reflected in its academic

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and administrative governance

Gauhati University is in its seventy-fifth year of glorious existence. The University has converted its vision and mission into reality through 44 academic departments under 7 faculties, one constituent college, one distant and online education institute, six centres, two constituent institutions and 302 affiliating colleges. Gauhati University has 459 approved faculty positions and the faculty strength in 2022-23 stands at 331. During the period 13 new faculties have been inducted into the University.

The process of implementation and introduction of NEP-2020 is an initiative for transforming higher education in the state NEP implementation was initiated through the formation of a core committee in July 2022.

NEP implementation was initiated through the formation of a Core committee in July 2022.

The university promoted research activities which are reflected in growing research support in the form of SAP, FIST, and PURSE, MeitY, Govt of India. The research initiatives are reflected in 587 publications and 57 research grants. The university is a participant in prestigious projects launched by NINJAL, Japan. The Gauhati University secured 9Patents(2022-2023) and 16 Students have been selected for GU Research Fellowship grants

MOUS were signed with ICCR, MoEA, Government of India for Academic, research, Institute of Inland Fisheries Potsdam Sacrow Germany, IIIE Guwahati, MSME, Government of Assam Cotton University, Directorate of Census Operations.

Gauhati University with its 300 + affiliating colleges implemented NEP 2020 with a very detailed policy-level update. The initiative for this was started on 2nd August 2021. Several task forces were formed for the preparation of an Institutional plan for NEP 2020

under UGC's Quality Mandate Initiative.

A Committee was constituted on 23/1/2023 to formulate various SEC, VAC, and MOOC courses.

On 1st February 2023, a nodal Officer for NEP was appointed, and a dedicated web page outliningtheNEP2020 implementation road map at GU was published live through https://web.gauhati.ac.in/nep on 11th February 2023 which is visible at https://gauhati.ac.in.

The Academic Council meeting held on 13/5/23, approved the courses. The FYUGP details were made public through the NEP Portal at https://nep.gauhati.ac.in on 15/5/2023.

To implement the courses effectively, the meeting of the Principals of Provincialized Colleges and the NEP implementation committee for FYUGP was held on 22/5/2023. The Regulations for the GU Four-Year Undergraduate Programme were floated on 6th June 2023.

Admission and Examination are organized through a completely inhouse maintained portal "onlinegu.in". serving lakhs of students from affiliated colleges, and from the campus.

6.2 - Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 - The institutional Strategic plan is effectively deployed

Gauhati University laid down its fifteen-year strategic plan (effective 2017) with a vision to make the institute at par with global top-ranked Universities. To deploy the laid down plan the University has taken up various steps in diverse thrust areas as outlined below.

As per the academic plan, new courses and modifications of the

existing course curriculum have been undertaken through a wellestablished regulatory procedure and .discussed in the Committee of Courses & Syllabi (CCS) and approved in the faculty meeting and subsequently by the Academic Council (GU).

6.2.2 - The functioning of the institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

The follow-up actions and regular functioning of the Executive Committee, some of the matters appraised in the previous meetings were ratified in the academic year 2022-23. For example, the EC approved the proposal for a 1:15 interview process in the teaching posts as per the UGC regulations 2018 that was appraised in the EC meetings held in 2021-22, and also adopted the Scheme for Compassionate Family Pension in lieu of Compassionate Appointment as notified by the Govt of Assam. Likewise, the EC approved - (1) "incentives" for eligible GU employees for the acquisition of additional higher qualifications as laid down by CPC-2017, (2) Reconstituted New Construction Committee, (3) Constituted New Leave

Rule Framing Committee. There was a new appointment of a total of 13 Teaching faculties, 12 Non-Teaching Staff, and 35 CAS promotions in the year 2022-23.

Opening of new vocational courses are the examples that are evident from the G.U. Academic Council Meetings held in 2022-23. The university also takes active roles in both academic and administrative matters such as the constitution of College Governing Bodies, Courses in its affiliated colleges, recognition of Ph.D. guideship, Inspection of colleges etc.

The performance evaluation system and the avenues for promotion are under the IQAC's supervision. For the purpose of gathering yearly academic data, IQAC has created two digital platforms (AROHAN & ADR). RC/FIP/STC events have been organized by UGC-HRDC,GU in compliance with UGC regulation which helps in the career advancement of the teachers.GU Teacher's Cooperative Welfare Fund is an independent contributory fund for Teacher's welfare that provides personal loans up to Rs. 7, 00,000.The majority of the teaching and non-teaching staff are housed on the university's residential campus. All employees have access to maternity, paternity, and childcare leaves, as well as medical

assistance. For the benefit of university personnel, medical reimbursement services are offered. The retired worker is also routinely paid a pension. Additionally, employees in need are given housing loan provisions. The University also has a provision for festival advance (24,000) available. funds for department-specific Journal publication. On campus, there is a daycare facility with a caregiver. The employee can also access LTC facilities.

The Gauhati University is a Government aided state university. For the year 2022-23 a grant in aid of Rs. 140,69,16,000/- (Rupees One forty crore, sixty nine lakh and sixteen thousand only) has been allotted. It receives grants mainly from Assam Government as grant in aid.

For Infrastructure and other development, it receives fund periodically from RUSA, TNEIF, and USIS etc. Internal resources mobilization from various sources in 2022-23 with amount of 122,87,48,485/- (Rupees One twenty two crore, eighty seven lakh, forty eight thousand and four hundred eighty five only) was generated through the following:

The Gauhati University court ultimately exercises financial control after being assisted by Finance Committee, Construction Committee, Tender Committee, and Executive Council. The usage is documented in the Cash book, the Finance Registers, and the Ledger. Various initiatives funded by the financing agencies make use of the infrastructure awards received from RUSA and other funding organizations. Project grants are used in accordance with the granting agency's recommendations using PFMS, TSA, Digi Pay, and other means.

All the funds received from the government and other agencies are audited internally (Internal Audit of Gauhati University) as well as externally (Account General Team, Govt. of Assam). Gauhati University has well defined internal Audit Section to verify and examine Cash Books, Stock registers, etc. taking at the end of the financial year for all the departments. The external audit is conducted regularly by the Local Fund (Audit) Govt. of Assam. The reply of IR issued by the Local Fund (Audit) is submitted on a regular basis. The periodic external audit is conducted as per provisions of the Gauhati University Act 1947; Section 20 as amended in 2013. The external Audit is also conducted by the Principal Accountant General (Audit) Assam regularly. University has a standing Committee on Audit to review all matters relating to the audit Audit Paras, objections/ observations, replies, etc. The reply of the Inspection Reports issued by the Principal Accountant General (Audit) is submitted through the standing Audit Committee. PFMS mapping from grants received from the funding agencies namely DST, DBT, ICMS, ICSSR, RUSA, DSIR, AICTE, MoES, NSS, ISRO, PRC, and NEC has been done facilitating transparency in the financial management of the university. All payments to the university are received through Payment Gateway through IUMS Portal.

- · Radioactive wastes are either relocated to the neutron howitzer room, which has a thick concrete wall or buried deep within the soil with proper

shielding.

- · Toilets have been facilitated with a proper disposal system. Sanitary Napkin incinerators have been installed in the girls' hostels.
- The Institute renewed its Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with M/s Fresh Air to collect waste on a pay-as-you-go basis from time to time. It involves a biological waste management programme in which hazardous materials, including solid waste and chemicals, are transferred to Fresh Air.

The Vermicomposting units of UGC-HRDC, Gauhati University and the Department of Botany, Gauhati University, are functioning efficiently to create enriched organic compost to be used at different locations of the university.

In order to address the water logging problem in the University Campus and the improvement of the drainage system inside as well as outside the Gauhati University Campus, the University has taken measures to clean the drains and culverts and to maintain the water bodies in the campus in a more efficient and effective manner, with some innovative ways such as facilitating groundwater reservoirs.
