

Edward Said in Orientalism argues that during the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, the West visualised the Orient and the O the Orient as a site where everything in need of correction or containment was situated, so that any image emerging from emerging from such an orientalist perspective would signify the need for surveillance, study, discipline or governing. governing. From this standpoint, Mary Shelley's Frankenstein comes across as an instance of the tendency of Western Faith of Western Enlightenment to assimilate what it deems undesirable and/or threatening in the Orient as the Other, Such Other. Such a reading becomes possible when one looks at the 'oriental' character of Safie (the Arabian) who is transformed in history and literature. She, is transformed into a liberal woman through her 'Western' education steeped in history and literature. As she gradually acquires the language, manners, culture and history of England, the monster also begins to enter into the realm of language and culture by emulating Safie's speech and actions. However, the monster's access to Western knowledge does not give him entry into the world of the Enlightened West. Again, while Henry Clerval's interests in Oriental literature and languages is motivated by commercial aspects, Frankenstein is attracted more by the erotic and sexualised landscape that he imaginatively constructs out of his readings of Oriental tales in translation. All these images conjured in the novel become indicative of the way the Orient is otherised by both dominant patriarchal institutions and practices and by the emergent 19th-century feminism. However, the figure of the monster can perhaps be seen as effecting or at least attempting to effect a subtle subversion of such a discourse. My paper will attempt to read Mary Shelley's Frankenstein against the grain through an exploration of these issues.







1. Preamble

The Department of Physics under the Gauhati University is a fast growing department which was started in the year 1954 with the primary objectives of developing quality manpower in the form of teachers and scientists in the field of different areas of physics. Dr. B. Borooah Cancer Institute is a recognized Institute for cancer treatment & research, which can act as a platform for broad based collaboration between Department of Physics. GU and Dr.BBCI. Both Department of Physics, GU and Dr.BBCI.can be mutually supportive and beneficial for the common cause of advancement of academic quality by introducing specialized new course in the field of Radiological Physics for the benefit of the people of the country and the north castern region in particular.

2. Purpose and Objectives

The purpose of this MoU is to create a frame work for a platform of collaboration with the following specific objectives:

- (a) To establish a close linkage and functional coordination between Department of Physics, GU and Dr. B. Borooah Cancer Institute
- (b) To recognize Dr. B. Borooah Cancer Institute as an accredited centre for study and research by Gauhati University, Guwahati.
- (c) To introduce Radiological Physics as a separate discipline for teaching and training by Department of Physics. GU and Dr.BBCI to fill up the shortage of medical physicists in the country and north eastern region in particular for the benefit of radiation oncology and allied discipline.
- (d) To offer 2 years (Semester System) plus 1 year internship Post Graduate course (M.Sc.) in Radiological Physics leading to M.Sc. Degree jointly by Dr.BBCI and GU and to assess and accredit the skilled based teaching programme offered by the Department of Radiation Oncology of Dr.BBCI as well as the Dept. of Physics, GU which may make it possible for awarding Post Graduate degree by the Gauhati University in future.
- (e) The minimum qualification for admission into the course will be B.Sc. with Physics as major subject.
- (f) To create / develop new experimental / theoretical facilities in both the institutes through mutual cooperation of Dr.BBCI and Department of Physics, GU and exchange ideas from various experts.
- (g) To make joint effort to conduct research, training and consultancy in the areas of health in India and abroad and to facilitate generation of fund for this purpose jointly by both the parties.
- (h) Any earning and expenditure for the purpose of this course / any related matter under this MoU made by both the institutes should be made transparent by both the institutes to each other.
- (i) All policy matters relating to academics, examinations, administration and finance of the course will be decided by an Executive Committee constituted by members of both the Institutes.

f) Dr.BBCI shall promote, conduct and monitor the programme through its network and Gauhati University as per the guidelines issued by Gauhati University from time to time.

- g) DI BBCI shall advertise the programme in leading national dailies in the name of Gauhati University and promote the course at its own cost.

d) Dr.BBCI shall pay a sum of Rs. 2,00,000/- (Rupees two lac only) at the time of signing the MOU' in the form of Demand Draft Payable to the "Registrar Gauhati University, Guwahati" as : refundable security deposit which shall not earn any interest. The security amount shall be refunded at the time of expiry or termination of the MOU.

e) The registration and other fees which will be collected from the students by Dr.BBCI must be sent to GU at the time of admission / re-registration and there shall be no sharing.

f) The Executive Committee reserves the right to revise the fees included in this course.

g) Executive Committee has the right to alter at any point of time the percentage of fund sharing.

Additional Responsibility:

Gauhati University shall assign any additional responsibility to Dr.BBCI as it may consider necessary for the qualitative conduct of the programme in consultation with Dr. BBCI.


