

SUMMARY REPORT OF EXTENSION ACTIVITIES BY VARIOUS ACADEMIC DEPARTMENTS, IQAC, OFFICE OF THE DIRECTOR OF STUDENTS' WELFARE & GAUHATI UNIVERSITY NSS CELL FOR THE PERIOD 2018 -2023

Various Academic Departments, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), NSS Cell and College NSS Units of Gauhati University conducted various Extension Activities during the year 2018-23 under the guidance of the Vice-Chancellor, GU, Chairman, Director, Students' Welfare, GU, and Program Coordinator, GU NSS Cell. Some of the selected activities conducted during 2018-23 are given as under.

Extension Activities by the Department of Zoology, Gauhati University: Adoption of few Villages of Aspirational Dima Hasao, Baksa, Udalguri, Kamrup (R) and Goalpara District of Assam for Livelihood Generation

Aquaculture and Biodiversity Center established under UGC-SAP of department of Zoology, has been contributing in the aquaculture sector of the state by giving training to the fish farmers across the state. The center is engaged in conducting outreach programs for fish micro-entrepreneurship in the state, generation of skilled labour and generation of self-employment through various activities such as — Brooder's management, natural and captive breeding of fish in controlled environment, hatchery maintenance, and fish seed preparation, Plankton Plus technology and post-harvest technologies of fish marketing. Presently, the center is in capacity to train 480 micro-entrepreneurs with MSME support from Govt. of India. Few of the Extension Activities conducted during 2018-2023 are mentioned below.

Topic: "Integrated Fish cum Livestock Farming, Demonstration and Training in the Selected Village of Two Aspirational District of Assam (Dima Haso & Udalguri) and Training and Demonstration on Cat Fish Breeding and Larval Rearing in Aspirational Goalpara District of Assam"



Objectives

- 1. To promote integrated fish farming and evaluating income from fish cum duck farming & Backyard poultry cum fish farming in rural set up to enhance livelihood of selected beneficiaries of the selected districts of Assam through training and demonstration.
- 2. To promote aquarium construction and its management along with rearing of candidate's endemic species of ornamental fishes through training and demonstration mode.
- 3. To promote Air breathing fish culture in Backyard Pond and tanks to earn more profit with less investment.

District-wise achievements made

1. Baksa district

- Thirteen awareness and training programme have been organized so far from April/2019 to February/2022
- Out of which Eight were In-house training program organized at Aquaculture & Biodiversity Centre, Department of Zoology; Gauhati University.











Achievement made in Baksa district...

1. Formation of working groups

A total of 12 working groups have been formed to fulfil all the components of work plan in accordance with the approved objectives.

2. Renovation & fertilization of selected pond

Five derelict society ponds (size-0.20, 0.25, 0.24, 0.35 & 0.28 hectares) of five villages of Tamulpur area were selected from demonstration unit. To facilitate **Integrated fish cum Duck farming**, all the selected ponds were renovated by dewatering, bottom scrapping, dyke trimming followed by Manuring with cowdung and







1. Selection of ponds for Integrated Fish cum Backyard poultry farming

Four pond of beneficiaries (size-0.22, 0.19, 0.28 & 0.30) of four villages of Tamulpur area for Fish cum Backyard poultry farming

2. Renovation & fertilization of selected pond

To facilitate Fish cum Backyard poultry farming, all the selected ponds were renovated by dewatering, bottom scrapping, dyke trimming followed by Manuring with cowdung and lime.



Training on management of Pond Productivity:

Hands on training were also imparted to the beneficiary to maintain the pond productivity in terms of plankton productivity. They were also impart practical training to













Demonstration on rearing of fingerlings in Integrated Fish com Livestock farming

Fingerlings (20-30 g) of *Rohu*, *Catla* and *Mrigala* were procured from a private fish farm of Nalbari district of Assam and released in all the selected ponds (numbers of fishes were calculated on the basis of stocking density & size of the ponds) into all the selected ponds after proper acclimatization.



Construction of Conventional Duckery & Poultry shed distribution of Duck (Campbell) & Backyard Poultry (Kamrupa)

100 ducklings(Campbell strain) (ratio of male : female :: 1:4) were introduced equally in five ponds and were reared in the duck shed constructed for the purpose.

80 chick (Kamrupa breed) at the age group of 7 days old were procured from College of Veterinary Science, Khanapara were introduced equally in four ponds and were reared in the shed constructed for the purpose.



- **■** Growth Performance of the Fish (IMC) and livestock in Integrated Farming System
- Mean growth of Catla was recorded maximum (1.9 kg) followed by Rohu & Mrigal with mean weight of 0.8kg & 0.7 kg respectively. duck & poultry dropping has increased the plankton population which in turn increased the growth of Catla.
- After six months of rearing of Duck/ Back yaed has initiates egg laying process





Training of Supplementary feed formulation

■ Training has also been imparted to formulate low cost supplementary feed for fish with the locally available low cost cereal ingredients and fish meal to ensure optimum proportion of Carbohydrate, Proteins, lipids, vitamins etc to the fishes.







Training on enhance pond productivity with a mixture of fermented cowdungs and others

■ Demonstration unit to enhance or retain pond productivity on regular basis with a mixture of cow dung and others. The mixture was prepared for one bigha pond (0.21 hectare).







■ Progress made in Objective-2:

Hands on training has also been imparted to the selected women beneficiaries of Baksa district. They were also trained in breeding & culture of exotic ornamental fish in Aquaculture & Biodiversity centre as well as in their village.



Achievement made in Objective-3

■ Two group of Ten beneficiaries has been formed to impart hands on training in Air breathing Fish culture (Singhi & Magur) in Backyard pond. At least 100 kg of Magur and 90 kg of singhi were harvested from each of the pond and sold @ Rs. 800 /kg of magur & Rs. 600/ singhi after one year of rearing.









Achievement made in Dima Hasao...







Tweleve training program has been organized out of which five were In- house training program organized Aquaculture & Biodiversity Department centre. of Zoology, Gauhati University, Guwahati and at Department of Zoology, Haflong Govt. College. The beneficiaries trained and aware were about the benefit of integrated Duck cum fish farming, Ornamental Fish Culture in Aquarium.



1. Formation of Working Group for Integrated Fish cum Livestock farming

A total of 8 working groups have been formed to fulfil all the components of work plan in accordance with the approved objectives. five ponds (size- 0.10. 0.12, 0.13, 0.18 & 0.90 hectares) of five selected beneficiaries of Gunjung & Maibang area were selected for demonstration unit for integrated duck /Backyard poultry cum fish farming. Renovation & fertilization of the pond has also been done to facilitate composite Fish farming.











Demonstration on rearing of fingerlings and release of ducklings/Backyard poultry

Fingerlings (25-30 g) of *Rohu, Catla* and *Mrigala* were procured from a private and released in all the selected ponds (numbers of fishes were calculated on the basis of stocking density & size of the ponds) after proper acclimatization. Fifteen ducklings each of the the selected ponds of Gunjung area & 25 Backyard poultry each of the selected pond of Maibang area were distributed













Progress made in Kamrup (R) district.....

Training & Demonstration Unit:

Five training program were also organized amongst the selected beneficiaries of Kamrup (rural) district (Hajo & Chaygaon). Yearlings of Indian Major Carps were also distributed amongst the selected beneficiaries @ 3kg yearling of IMC/beneficiaries in their ponds. Two demonstration unit of Fish cum Duck farming has also been set up in the district.

Visible Impact of the Project

- Conversion of derelict and unproductive fish ponds of the beneficiaries into a productive fish pond to enhance livelihood of the beneficiaries.
- One of the most significant impact has been observed during covid-19 infested period especially during total lock down in 2020, when beneficiaries thrive their livelihood only by selling the Fish and eggs of their ponds through home delivery in nearby area
 - Production of fish food using animal waste has also become popular amongst marginal & progressive fish farmers of the said districts especially in Dima Hasao district.
 - Uses of fermented mixtures of Cow dung, Rice bran, Mustard oil cake, and molasses through yeast became popular in the selected district to enhance Plankton Productivity of the pond.

Sustainability of the Intervention of the project

- 08 Self help group has already created/reactivated in Baksa & Dima Hasao district
- Fish, eggs and Ducks are selling directly to local market.
- Marketing Linkage has also been created with local ornamental fish traders and Fishfed an organisation of Govt. of Assam.

Village Adoption by the Department of Geography, Gauhati University: Adoption of Muktapur Village as a Micro-Field Laboratory for Sustainable Rural Development

Having expertise knowledge of the faculty members in the field of micro areas studies, floodplain landscapes and livelihoods, rural development, regional analysis, resource management and geospatial techniques, the Department of Geography, Gauhati University adopted a floodplain village called Muktapur located in Kamrup district of Assam, which is 35 km towards the north from the Department. The Geography Department has adopted this village in 2006 as a micro-field laboratory to carry out an intensive investigation on different aspects of the village, such as rural landscapes and livelihoods, rural ecological settings and their changes over time caused by the influence of climate change and other modern socio-economic processes. The main objectives behind this village adoption are-(i) to suggest measures to the villagers for sustainable livelihoods through proper resource utilization and land use planning in the present day context of environmental degradation, climate change and socio-economic transformation, and (ii) to give students and the concerned researchers a space for getting micro-study and micro field survey training experience and orientation.




Fig. 1. Book published on the activities of the village adaptation in Assamese

Fortunately, this village has also been taken as an important study area for research by the Centre for South East Asian Studies (CSEAS), Kyoto University, Japan under a joint collaboration programme between the Department of Geography, GU and CSEAS, Kyoto University, Japan. Under the village adoption programme, the Department of Geography, GU in collaboration with the CSEAS, Kyoto University has already brought out a book in Assamese medium on rural agro-ecological systems and associated folk culture of the village (**Fig 1**). Besides, many university professors of abroad used to visit this village time to time with the faculty members of the Geography Department of Gauhati University to observe the village landscapes and livelihoods, and shared their expertise knowledge towards the sustainable village environment (**Fig 2**).

In order to address the changing rural agroecological systems and livelihood patterns in the context of environmental changes perceived by the villagers, especially the peasants, a village level workshop with the participation of more than 100 villagers was organized at Muktapur village on 25th August, 2019 by the Geography Department, GU with support from the Nara Womens' University and Tokoha University,

Japan (Fig 3).




Fig. 4. Book published on the activities of the village adaptation in English

Keeping in view of the participatory rural appraisal and rural development approaches, the said workshop provided scopes for an intimate interaction between the researchers of the universities and the villagers which is vitally necessary for the grass-root development of rural areas. Based on the research findings conducted by the universities and the villagers' opinions on the changing agroecological systems, an edited book entitled "Rural Livelihoods and Environmental Changes in Muktapur Village: Peoples' Voice" was brought out in 2020 (**Fig 4**). Besides, more than 10 research papers/articles have already been published by the faculty members of the associated Japanese universities and the Geography Department, Gauhati University focusing on different aspects of the village and recommending suggestions for sustainable rural livelihoods.

The Faculty members of the Department of Geography, GU also extended their help and cooperation in organizing a village survey and orientation programme at Muktapur village for the Chief Minister's Climate Resilient village fellowship programme conducted by the Assam Science Technology and Environmental Council, Govt. of Assam on 2nd March, 2024. A day-long survey and interaction programme with the villagers was carried out at the village for understanding and investigating the climate change impact on the rural life and livelihoods (**Fig. 5**).

Based on the ongoing research at Muktapur village, the Department of Geography proposes to implement some ecologically befitting and culturally adaptive action research programmes at the village from the year 2024 focusing on organic farming, agroforestry, resource management, etc with active participation of the villagers for achieving sustainable rural development goals.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED BY DEPARTMENT OF WOMEN STUDIES, GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

- 1. The students of the Fourth semester along with the teacher in-charge HoD, Professsor Alpana Borgohain of the Department of Women's Studies visited 'Prerona', a children's home located at Dibrugarh on 13/02/2019 as a part of their Extension Programme of their Field Visit and spent time with the children and distributed books, pencils, color pencils, erasers etc. Prerona is a home for nearly 41 children, who are either orphans or have fled their own families due to reasons of insecurity and violence. Prerona works for the all-round development of the children.
- 2. The Department of Women's Studies in collaboration with the Department of Sociology, Gauhati University conducted a meeting to arrange flood relief for affected people on 21/08/2019. The programme started with a brief note on the process of flood relief material distribution. The collected relief goods were decided to be distributed among the people of Majuli, the biggest River Island of the world and worst affected by floods. The materials were distributed through an NGO called Rural Economic Development Society which is based in Majuli.
- 3. Gauhati University Mental Health Task Force: Following an instruction from the University Grants Commission, the Gauhati University authorities have constituted a mental health task force to monitor the mental health, psychological aspects and well-being of the students during the present COVID-19 pandemic vide memo no. GU/Reg.(SF)/2020/79 dated 17.4.2020.The task force connected with individual students or the student community through mail, WhatsApp, telephonic calls, etc., to keep them fit during the current medical emergency situation. The task force comprised of Prof Sauravpran Goswami as Chairperson, Prof Polly Vauquline, Professor, Department of Women's Studies as Member Secretary.
- 4. The M.A. Batch of 2020-2022 (4th Semester, 2022), Department of Women's Studies initiated a **Cloth Bank** to collect washed clothes in good condition for distribution among the needy people.
- 5. Professor and Head, Polly Vauquiline along with students of the Department of Women's Studies distributed clothes among the students of the Parijat Academy located at Garchuk, Guwahati on 22-12-2022.
- 6. Students and Research Scholars of the Department of Women's Studies distributed clothes among the students of the Parijat Academy on **16-12-2023.**
- 7. Students of the Department of Women's Studies distributed clothes from the Cloth Bank at Babubasti Slum of Narengi, Guwahati on **20-12-2023**.
- 8. Students of the Department of Women's Studies distributed clothes from the Cloth Bank among the inmates of a Shelter Home for Mentally Challenged People at Kahilipara, Guwahati, **02-02-2024.**





EXTENSION ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED BY DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE, GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED BY DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY, GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

Students, Research Scholars and Faculties of the department conduct classes, interaction programs, awareness programs, career counseling and mentoring to the students of the nearby senior secondary schools of the University regularly every year. Some of the evidences are mentioned below.



EXTENSION ACTIVITIES ORGANIZED BY OFFICE OF THE DIRECTOR OF STUDENTS' WELFARE AND NSS UNIT OF GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

Apart from the Departments, the GU-NSS unit has been instrumental in organizing various programs facilitating the interchange between community and the students. Regular Programs are being organized by the GU-NSS unit throughout the five years (2018-23) for creating awareness on different societal issues like child marriage, HIV, cleanliness drive, child trafficking, plantation drives, blood donations etc. During the pandemic the NSS played a vital role in spreading awareness about COVID-19 and in organizing vaccination drive for the teaching, non-teaching staff and the communities around the university campus at large. Mention may be made of the Swachh Bharat Summer Internship -100 hours of Swachhta Program conducted during July, 2018. Large no. of NSS volunteers under G NSS Cell enrolled their names in Swachh Bharat Summer Internship Program. Various cleanliness drives, plantation drives, awareness programs, door to door campaigns in the adopted villages were organized during the period. The volunteers were made to involve themselves in various activities all through the day during the program.

SWACHH BHARAT SUMMER INTERNSHIP -100 HOURS OF SWACHHTA

Large no. of NSS volunteers under GU NSS Cell enrolled their names in Swachh Bharat Summer Internship

Program. Program Coordinator, GU NSS Cell was the Nodal Officer for GU PG Classes & Program Officers of different college units served as a nodal officer of their respective units for the programs. The duration of the internship was 15 days (100 hours) to be conducted w.e.f.15th June to 31st July, 2018. Accordingly NSS units under GU NSS Cell took out various cleanliness drives during the period. The volunteers were made to involve themselves in various activities all through



the day during the programs. Various programs during the internship were:

INAUGURATION OF SWACHH BHARAT SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Swachh Bharat Summer Internship Program was inaugurated in the adopted village in Sonapur village in Dimoria Block of Kamrup (M) by Dr. Ranjan Kr. Kakati, Director, Students' Welfare, GU & Program Coordinator, GU NSS Cell held from 26th to 31st July, 2018. He also delivered a brief speech on necessity of cleanliness and the role Swachh Bharat Summer Internship Program can play in cleaning villages and urban slums. The speech was followed by the NSS song performed by the NSS volunteers.

THE ACTIVITIES ACCOMPLISHED DURING THE PERIOD OF INTERNSHIP

- **Morning warm up sessions and exercises** were the integral part of the internship program. Participation of every volunteer in the morning session was mandatory.
- Cleaning Drive in the campus and in adopted village.
- Plantation Drive in and around the campus.
- Visit to the primary school of the adopted village and interacted with students on the basic rules of health and hygiene.
- Organised environmental awareness programs in the school of the adopted village. Posters on
 environment were shown and discussed by the volunteers and program officer in a lucid manner.
 Organised door to door campaign in the locality on cleanliness and how to maintain a healthy
 environment.
- Conducting survey by female volunteers and educating girls of the area on maintaining hygiene and sanitation.
- Counselling by female volunteers and educating girls of the area on girl trafficking and measures.

GU NSS Cell volunteers in the adopted village at Garigaon during the month of July, 2019 conducted survey on solid waste management system, women's sanitation, child nutrition and harmful effects of single use plastic materials. Although the area is located nearby city most of the people were not aware on different schemes provided by central and state governments. Accordingly awareness was conducted on these issues amongst the villagers.

1. As per instruction from Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Govt. of India, GU NSS Cell organised Fit India Movement on 29 August, 2019 in GU Campus. GU Students & NSS volunteers participated in the program inspired by nation-wide movement in India to encourage people to remain healthy and fit by including physical activities and sports in their daily lives. It was in support of Fit India Movement launched by Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi at Indira Gandhi Stadium in New Delhi on 29 August 2019.



- 2. GU NSS Cell nominated ten Program Officers for Training of Trainers on Life Skills at Rajiv GandhiUniversity, Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh w.e.f. 16th 20th September, 2019.
- 3. **A Program on "Capacity Building on Entrepreneurship Development"** for NSS Volunteers was held at Gauhati University *w.e.f.* 25-09-2019 to 27-09-2019 sponsored by Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Regional Centre, Chandigarh.
- 4. Fourteen GU NSS Cell Program Officers participated in an orientation program on Youth Development held at Indian Institute of Entrepreneurship (IIE), Guwahati w.e.f. 30th September to 4th October, 2019.
- 5. GU NSS Cell organized "Inter Hostel Cleanliness Competition" held among the Gauhati University Hostels on the occasion of 150th Years of Birth Anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi on 2nd October, 2019.
- 6. Forty GU NSS Program Officers participated in a program on 'Capacity Building of Youth on Leadership & Personality Development through Life Skills' held at Don Bosco Institute, Kharguli, Guwahati w.e.f. 18th 22nd November, 2019.





7. During COVID-19 pandemic 2020NSS Volunteers under the instruction of Program Coordinator, GU NSS Cell from March to June, 2020 created and uploaded in social media Covid-19 awareness videos on topics like importance of sanitisation, maintenance of social distance, wearing of masks etc. They also uploaded videos on how to prepare masks from easily available household clothes. The Program Officers and NSS volunteers also spread awareness on stopping Stigmatization during Corona virus pandemic.

- 8. NSS volunteers of different NSS units under GU NSS Cell prepared about 50,000 masks and distributed in their adopted villages and their respective neighborhoods and to different shopkeepers.
- 9. NSS volunteers of Hatsingimari College under GU NSS Cell were deputed by District administration of South Salmara-Mankachar for smooth running of Covid -19 Screening centre.
- 10. GU NSS volunteers participated in an online NSS training for Covid -19 that was organised on 22 April, 2020.
- 11. GU NSS volunteers participated in a National level webinar on 'The Impact of COVID -19 on Tobacco Users' on 31st May, 2020. About 250 NSS volunteers and Program Officers participated in the webinar.
- 12. NSS volunteers of Gauhati University Campus along with different NSS units under GU NSS Cell distributed food items, essential items, sanitary pads etc. to about 2 lakh needy people. As approached by GU campus NSS volunteers, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, GU Prof. Pratap Jyoti Handique and Director, Students' Welfare, GU Dr Ranjan Kr. Kakati personally donated fund to purchase flood relief material.
- * PLANTATION DURING 2020-2021: Every NSS Unit conducts plantation drive in their institutional campus as well as at Adopted villages. 210 Plantation drives were organized by all the NSS Units during which 50000 saplings were planted in the college campus, adopted villages, local schools and public places. Instructions were given to all the Units for selection of saplings, conduct survey before plantation, care for every saplings by each volunteers for two years. Follow up action to be taken accordingly by all NSS Units and Program Coordinator, GU NSS Cell.
- ❖ BLOOD DONATION CAMP DURING 2020-2021: Among all the NSS units during the session 2020-2021 volunteers donated around 1500 units during the year. Also, as and when necessary volunteers were informed through WhatsApp group message to donate Blood in local hospitals to needy peoples.
- ❖ DURING 2020-2021350 AIDS/ Health awareness programs were organized by all the NSS units to raise awareness on different health related issues and to sensitise people of the adopted villages and nearby community of the institutions. Mental health supporting programs were also organised during this COVID-19 pandemic situation.
- ❖ ENVIRONMENT PROGRAMMES DURING 2020-2021: 220 programs on Environment awareness were organized by all the NSS Units to raise awareness on protecting the environment and conservation of Biodiversity resources. NSS Volunteers and Program Officers were trained about sustainable development goals (SDG) of United Nations and ask to follow up action plans accordingly in our concern areas.
- ❖ DURING THE PERIOD 2020- 2021:-156 awareness programs on Youth & career development, sports, Drugs Abuse Prevention, women empowerment, National Unity, Disaster management,

- women trafficking, Science day, leadership and personality development, Life skill etc were organized by all the NSS Units
- CLEANLINESS DRIVES DURING 2020- 2021: 350 Cleanliness drives were organized under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan in colleges, adopted villages, schools, public offices and places by all the NSS units. Summer Internship Program and Swachhata Pakhwada were also organised as per action plan of Ministry of Youth Affairs, Govt. Of India and Directorate of NSS, New Delhi in all the NSS units. This year due to COVID-19 Pandemic, proper protocols were maintained for smooth completion of the cleanliness drives.

SPREADING OF AWARENESS DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD AND ESSENTIALITEMS AND MASKS ETC.

At the start of the year 2020 the world had to face a new viral COVID -19 diseases which were declared as pandemic by World Health Organization. During the COVID- 19 lockdown period enforced by the government the NSS volunteers of GU NSS Cell realized that they had enormous responsibility to lend a helping hand to the local administration in creating awareness amongst the general public against the disease.

The Gauhati University NSS Cell devised a strategy and had assigned one Program Officer each as District Nodal Officer (DNO) in all districts to help State NSS Officer & Program Coordinator to fight against COVID- 19 pandemic. All the DNO's had met the concerned District Administration to discuss about the utilization of the service of NSS to fight against COVID -19. COVID Warriors of the NSS units of all districts conducted various activities to create awareness and help people during COVID pandemic. Some of the achievements are mentioned below:

- A) MAKING OF VIDEO CLIPS ON COVID-19 AWARENESS: More than 100 video clips in Assamese, Hindi and English dialect on Corona virus awareness were prepared by NSS Volunteers from different NSS units under GU NSS Cell. The video clips covering the topics like importance of wearing face masks, washing hands frequently etc were uploaded in the social media platforms to help target the people residing in the rural areas. This was found to be very helpful for spreading awareness about Covid-19 among the public.
- B) TELEPHONIC CONSULTATION WITH THE PEOPLE WHO WERE QUARANTINED: NSS volunteers of some Colleges under GU NSS Cell made telephonic conversation with the

quarantined people and consulted them to provide mental relief. Accordingly the quarantined people also expressed their gratitude towards the NSS volunteers.

C) **BLOOD DONATION:** During this period, NSS volunteers and Program Officers tied up with all the district blood banks and assured them to donate blood by the NSS Volunteers whenever there is a shortage. NSS volunteers had donated more than 1500 units of blood to different hospitals in their

respective districts.

D)PREPARING AND SUPPLYING FOOD ITEMS TO THE NEEDY PEOPLE: NSS Volunteers and PO's prepared food items and supplied them to the needy ones. Food and essential items including sanitary napkins, hand sanitizer etc were provided to around 2,00,000 needy people in their adopted villages and locality during the COVID period. Also many institution& colleges under GU NSS Cell have distributed foods items to the attendants of COVID-19 patient in there tough time by the NSS Volunteers.

E) MAKING AND DISTRIBUTION OF FACE MASKS TO THE LOCAL PEOPLE:

More than 50,000 face masks were prepared by the NSS Volunteers of different NSS units using the available household materials which were distributed to the local people, neighbours, vendors, traffic police etc. Also the NSS volunteers and PO's from many institutions distributed hand sanitizers and face masks to the homeless people.

- F) MAINTENANCE OF SOCIAL DISTANCING AT PUBLIC PLACES: In most of the districts, NSS volunteers aware people about maintaining social distancing at public places like hospitals, medical stores, vegetable shops, banks etc. NSS Unit of some Colleges organized a door to door COVID-19 and Vaccination Awareness Program in their locality with the guidance of Program Officers. During the awareness program, volunteers visited different households of their adopted villages and interacted with individuals about the pandemic, importance of vaccination, sanitization, online registration process for vaccination etc.
- G) VOLUNTEERS WORKING IN DIFFERENT VACCINATION CENTRES: NSS Volunteers from Gauhati University NSS Cell and different units under GU NSS Cell also step forward towards helping the medical authorities during the vaccination processes at the vaccination centres. They have perfume duty in different vaccination centres and helped the medical staff during registration process for vaccination and help the people to register themselves in cowin.go.in & AarogyaSetu application. Around 900 volunteers have been engaged in different vaccination centres from different colleges under GU NSS Cell.
- * NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY 2020 AND ROLE OF NSS: A national webinar on National Education policy 2020 and Role of NSS was organized by Gauhati University NSS Cell on 19 September, 2020. The webinar was attended by Prof. Nani Gopal Mahanta, Dept. of Political Science, G.U. and Dr. Stanzin Dawa, Former Regional Director, RGNIYD, Govt. of India and Principal, Lamdon Model Senior Secondary School, Leh. The webinar was well attended by 200 NSS volunteers, Program Officers, PG students amongst others.
- **❖ INTERNATIONAL WEBINAR ON ENERGY ACCESS AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT HELD AT GU:** An international webinar on Energy Access and Rural Development was organized by GU NSS Cell in collaboration with the Centre for Participatory Action and Social Support (CPASS) on 5th November, 2020. The webinar was attended by Prof. Pratap Jyoti Handique, Vice − Chancellor, G.U., Dr. Ranjan Kr. Kakati, Director, Students' Welfare, G.U. & Program Coordinator, NSS Cell, Prof.

Manabendra Pathak, IIT Patna amongst others. Dr. Claudio Lutzky of George Mason University, Argentina made a detailed presentation on agriculture, energy and gender. Tridip Kumar Goswami, Global Head of Compliance C Quest Capital Washington DC also delivered his presentation.









GU NSS CELL CELEBRATED NATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAYON 24TH JANUARY, 2022


