## A brief overview of K. K. Handiqui Library, Gauhati University

Established in 1948, the Krishna Kanta Handiqui Library (KKHL) was founded to address the academic needs of students, teachers, and research scholars of the University. It not only supports the University's classroom instructional programs but also broadens the horizon of knowledge relevant to diverse research and higher education programs conducted by the University and its affiliates. As a crucial component in upholding the University's mission to establish high standards of excellence, the KKH Library plays a major role in preserving, conserving, and disseminating knowledge. It serves as an effective instrument in the process of development and upliftment for the state of Assam and the entire country by faithfully and comprehensively passing on the literary, cultural, scientific, and technological experiences of mankind accumulated over the millennia. This ensures the continuity and advancement of human civilization.

Right from its initial stage in 1948, the library started functioning in Chandmari (now known as the old University Colony) and then shifted to Room No.1 of the Arts Building, Gauhati University and accommodated itself in the present building in 1962. In 1982, the University Library was renamed the K. K. Handiqui Library in honor of its first Vice Chancellor, K. K. Handiqui, an Orientalist of world fame.

### Implementation of ILMS (Integrated Library Management System):

The process of automation in the KKH Library via the Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) was initiated way back with the execution of CDS/ISIS in the year 1995. It was in the year 2001 that the software SOUL 1.0 version began its first functioning in the premise of the KKHL. In 2009 SOUL 2.0 version was initiated under the direction of the INFLIBNET. Digitization accelerated during this period and has been in practice till 2021 with SOUL 3.0 finally being implemented in the year 2022. The entire library management system starting from the issue and return of books, library cataloguing, book binding, acquisition, processing and database of the users of the library, database of number of books and journals presently in the possession of the library, member status, OPAC, WEB OPAC search option, library application record system for users and the ESSL software for library employees' attendance and similar such activities are being monitored, controlled and functioned through the SOUL 3.0.
